There is a new genealogical journal available. It is the <u>Journal of Genealogy</u>, published monthly. It is not mainly a "journal of queries" and classified type ads but has real substance and in-depth reporting on a variety of major areas of interest. Each issue is devoted to one of these major areas such as the August 1978 issue which is devoted to "Researching Missouri". A subscription may be ordered by writing PO Box 31097, Omaha, NE 68131. The yearly 12 issue rate is \$12.

Don't forget to check in the "Genealogical Helper" under the section of Genealogical Columns of all the places you can send in free queries. I started to list some of them, but there are just too many. I have been corresponding with one in Missouri and they really go out of their way to be helpful.

The speaker for October 23 will be Gary Drummond, author of A Guide to Architectural Styles In The Livermore Amador Valley. He will talk about the use of architecture in "dating" old houses, and about using county records in researching the history of a house or piece of property. He would like to make it a self-help program for anyone trying to research the history of a house.
