Dear Mrs. Fazio:

Thank you for contacting me with your concerns. I understand your desire to keep these documents.

Unfortunately, there is not enough storage space for all of these applications to be kept. Three measures are taken to ensure that nothing is lost when the documents are destroyed.

Before these documents are destroyed all the information on them, not just parts, is put into the computer system. The documents are also put on microfilm. The microfilm is developed and compared to the original application to ensure the two are equally legible before the application is destroyed. The final safeguard against losing valuable information is that all files must also be reviewed and approved for disposal by the National Archives.

I am sorry that there isn't enough storage room to keep all the original documents. However, I do think that the methods employed by the Social Security Administration will ensure that the information on them is not lost.

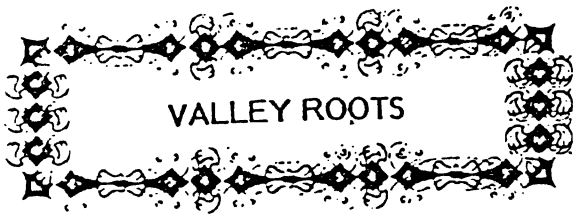
If you have any further questions about this issue, or experience any difficulty accessing records which have been destroyed, please contact me.

Pleasanton Lodge, No. 218, F. and A.M., was organized 26 August, 1871, a dispensation having been granted by the Grand Master, L.E. PRATT, to James BEAZELL, Charles M. DOUGHERTY, Frederick KAPP, Louis W. WINN, William A. JORDAN, John S.

MOORE, Isaac W. GOLDMAN, Harris ARENDT, John A. BILZ, John KOOPMAN, Andrew J. TAYLOR, Joseph HARRIS, and Henry ANGELOPULO.

The meetings of the lodge were held at Pleasanton until November, 1874, in which month the lodge was moved to Livermore. The present (1878) officers are, James BEAZELL, W.M.; W.A. MCKEE, S.W.; W.W. WYNN, J.W.; Joseph HARRIS, Treasurer; W.H. WRIGHT, Secty; William MASSIE, S.D.; John BECK, J.D.; M.P.H. LOVE, Marshall; R.B. CAMPBELL and F.R. FASSET, Stewards. The lodge has forty members.

THE COXSACKIE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE
AND
ITS PATRIOT SIGNERS
BY Olive WOODWORTH

On May 17, 1775, more than a year before the Declaration of Independence was presented at Philadelphia, the inhabitants of Coxsackie signed a Declaration of Independence of their own. The faded yellow parchment, found in an Albany attic some years ago, bears the names of 225 signers, most of them Dutch names of freeholders from the Coxsackie District of the colony of New York.

Within a month after this historic event on the Hudson the battles of Concord and Lexington had been fought, the British forces had attacked Bunker Hill, and Washington had been summoned to lead the American army surrounding Boston. Much of the excitement of the times can be felt when this document is read; and history records that the revolutionary fever reached a peak thirteen months later when, at Philadelphia, the Declaration of Independence was signed by all the colonies.

The Coxsackie Declaration was discovered by Mr. John M. Clark, then president of the Albany Institute and Historical and Art Society, who presented it to the Institute, where it remains. The document was pronounced authentic by Dr. Sullivan and Dr. Wyer, who served, respectively, as State historian and State librarian at that time, and by the State archivist. It was displayed among other selected material on the New York Freedom Train when it toured the State. Over the years the writing on the document has become faded and somewhat illegible; of the 225 signatures only 211 are de-

cipherable and presumed accurate. Some of the patriots, unable to write their names, signed with an "+." The first signer, John (Johannes) Schuneman, was undoubtedly the fighting "Dutch Dominic of the Catskills," for the letters V.D.S. meaning Verbus Dei Servus (Minister of the Word of God), appear after his name. And there is enough authentic data on the Dominic to provide assurance that he drew up the Declaration personally.

Anthony Van Bergen, the eighth signer, and Henry Van Bergen, the fourth signer, were Colonel and Captain, respectively, of the Coxsackie militia during the Revolution.

The Declaration follows:

"PERSUADED that the salvation of the Rights and Liberties of America, depends, under God, on the firm Union of its Inhabitants, in a vigorous prosecution of the Measures necessary for its Safety, and convinced of the Necessity of preventing the Anarchy and Confusion which attend a Dissolution of the Powers of Government:

"THAT the Freeholders and Inhabitants of Coxsackie District in the County of Albany, being greatly alarmed at the avowed Design of the Ministry to raise a Revenue in America, and shocked by the bloody Scene acting in the Massachusetts-Bay; DO in the most solemn Manner resolve never to become Slaves; and do also associate under all the Ties of Religion, Honour, and Love to our Country, to adopt and endeavor to carry

into Execution whatever may be rendered by the Continental Congress, or resolved upon by our provincial Convention and opposing the Execution of several arbitrary and oppressive Acts of the British Parliament, until a reconciliation between Great Britain and America or constitutional principles (which we most ardently desire) can be obtained; and that we will, in all Things, follow the advice of our general Committee, respecting the purpose aforesaid, the preservation of peace and Order, and the safety of Individuals and private property.

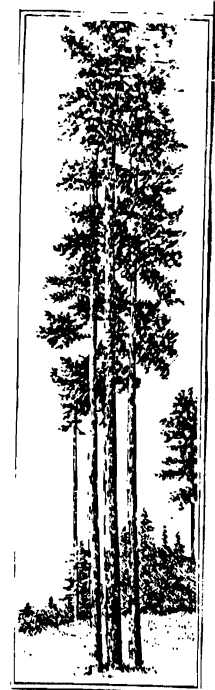

Ten-Year Cumulative Every-Name Index and Index to Major Subjects for *The Livermore Roots Tracer*. 1988. Compiled by George and Harriet Anderson. Published by the Livermore-Amador Genealogical Society, P.O. Box 901, Livermore, CA 94551. Soft cover, 8 1/2 x 11 inches, spiral bound, iv+25 pages, 5476 entries. Price to members: \$3, plus \$1 postage if mailed; to non-members: 6\$ postpaid. Two copies are in the LAGS Library.

The Livermore Roots Tracer is beginning its 11th year with this issue. To commemorate its first ten successful years, Harriet and I thought it would be appropriate to compile an index to all of the issues published to date. We probably should have done it much sooner — most of our sister publications are indexed from birth.

Our index provides a full-name citation for every occurrence of every person-name in all of the issues of **The Tracer** published through July 1988. The only exceptions are those names in the cemetery surveys printed in installments in **The Tracer** — these surveys were recently collected and reprinted in full, with index, in the LAGS book, **Livermore Cemeteries** (1988).

The index contains 5476 different names. Allowing for those persons who are indexed more than once under variant spellings of their surnames, and for females indexed under both maiden and married names, we estimate that over 5000 persons are referenced in the index.

A limited subject index is also included. In it are 437 citations to the subjects of major articles in **The Tracer**.

The Augustan Society Omnibus, Book 8. 1987. Published by The Augustan Society, Inc.,

P.O. Box P, Torrance, CA 90507-0210. Soft cover, 8 1/2 x 11 inches, perfect-bound, 160 pages, not indexed. \$10.

Seven journals under one cover make up this book. Each journal, except the last, is exactly 22 pages long. They are: *The Augustan*, *Chivalry*, *Genealogical Library Journal*, *The Colonial Genealogist*, *English Genealogist*, *Germanic Genealogist*, and *French Genealogist*.

The Augustan Society, named after Caesar Augustus, is not a new organization, and I even belonged for a short time some years ago, but I cannot remember how it defines its purpose, nor can I find a stated purpose in this **Omnibus**. The society has always been known for its interest in heraldry, genealogy of the nobility and related subjects, but less than half of this book is devoted to such matters.

Most of the articles are well written and sources are copiously cited. A sampling of titles gives some flavor of the contents of the **Omnibus**: "Duration of Empires", "Report from the Egyptology Study Group" [partly concerned with genealogy of the pharaohs], "Hereditary Order of Armigerous Augustans", "Emmaus El-Qubeibeh: A Little-known Crusader Castle" [by William David Setzekorn,

FAS, KCR, SDLKJ, OAA], "St. George: The Cult and The Legend", "Mohammed's American Progeny Reconsidered", "Studies in Early Celtic Genealogies: Dyfed", "William Gladstone and Peerages", "A Descent from Theodoric "the Great" of the Ostragoths", "French Heritage: Case Study of a French Teenager's Success in Discovering the Origins of His Family."

Each journal also has a section for queries and surname interest listings.

Heritage Quest, The International Genealogy Forum. Volumes 1-6 bound under one cover. 736 pages of good information — great for browsing. Donated by Barbara Barton.

Census Research Kit. Published by The Dollarhide System. A collection of 34 census maps, census forms and census analysis worksheets on cardstock, intended for do-it-yourself copying as needed.

GILBERT COPE

1840 - 1928

IF YOU ARE RESEARCHING IN PENNSYLVANIA, the work of Gilbert COPE might be of interest. He became the leading authority on Quaker genealogy and the history of Chester County, Pennsylvania.

His first published work was on his paternal line--The Cope Family was published in 1861 followed by major works on the surnames DUTTON, SHARPLESS, DUNWOODY, HOOD, DARLINGTON, SMEDLEY, BAILY, KIRK, and BRINTON.

Altogether, he spent sixty-four years gathering records, both in the United States and Europe where he, accompanied by his wife Anna, spent some nine months copying Quaker records---thirty volumes that cover the Quaker backgrounds of people who came to America.

His books, maps, newspapers, and other published materials, along with photographs and original historical papers were donated to The Historical Society of Pennsylvania in 1920. This collection consists of ninety-five large volumes of material relating to families of Pennsylvania, New Jersey and some southern states. This GILBERT COPE COLLECTION can be found at the headquarters of the Historical Society of Pennsylvania, 1300 Locust Street, Philadelphia, PA 19107.

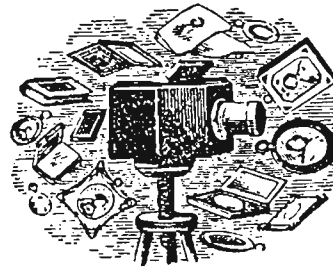

DID YOU KNOW that the surname LIVERMORE is a Welsh name, originally "LLEUFER, meaning light, and MAWR, meaning great.

Do you have some CABINET CARDS??

The cabinet card is probably one of the best-known and most commonly-found photographic forms from the 19th century, popular from the mid 1860s to about 1900. A photograph usually a portrait, was mounted on a 6½ x 4¼" card, with the photographer's name often appearing on the front under the photograph and/or on the back. For these portraits, photographers began working with light and background objects or scenery in order to achieve particular artistic effects. From about 1869, negatives were sometimes retouched to improve facial features and to obtain a greater range of intermediate tones. Dramatic and highly "staged" poses were common. This era saw the first largescale production of portraits of celebrities in the performing arts.

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MORE ABOUT THOSE PASSENGER LISTS

No passenger left Europe without some type of documentation giving that person permission to leave the country. Therefore, European ports of departure records may include a record of that permission. In colonial times the ship's captain kept separate passenger and crew lists. Passenger lists very often did not include the names of those who paid in advance for a voyage. The list did include the names of those whose passage was to be paid on arrival, or in some way involved reimbursement. In some instances, the passage of a wife and daughters was paid, and the father and sons worked as crew members to pay their way. Thus, the females appeared on the passenger list, the males on the crew list. The Alien and Sedition Act of 1798 required the registration of all aliens entering the United States, being recorded by the Department of State.

* In Great Britain and the Colonies double dating was used over a period of 170 years (1582-1752). This was due to the conflict between the historical calender which recognized March 21st as the first day of a new year in accordance with the ecclesiastical calender, and the Gregorian Calender which proclaimed January 1st as the beginning of the new year. Double dating was used only between Jan.1st and March 25 in the years from 1582-1752. All dates before the change were called Old Style (OS) and after 1582 New Style (NS). Sometimes dates between 1582-1782 are shown as "1750/51".
