Sailing to America: Passenger Lists Before 1900

Travel by ships has occurred around the world for hundreds of years. Gaining passage on ships in earlier years was costly, unless an alternative way to pay was made available to those seeking emigration opportunities. Indentured Servitude often filled the need for millions of orphans, prisoners, single men and women, the emotionally unstable, and even families. Sailing to America: Passenger Lists Before 1900 features emigration and immigration record types, major ports, tips for finding an ancestor's homeland, useful websites, and online search topics.

Sharon D. Monson is a Professional Genealogist and Public Speaker. She is the author of Shortcut to Genealogy Sources, and creator of the Genealogy Kit, complete with a newly designed six-generation Ancestor Chart. She is a frequent conference and webinar presenter. Her extensive research experience in Courthouses, Archives, and the Family History Library spans 40+ years. Sharon's classes cover sources, methodology, and research tips to make your library and online searches successful

Articles should be saved in either Microsoft Word (.doc or .docx) or Rich Text format. Use footnotes to cite sources for facts that are not general knowledge. No need to worry about knowing how to cite history sources, our editors can assist you with this task. Photographs should also be emailed as separate files and labeled. Please include possible captions for each item. Photographs, when scanned, should be in either .jpg or .tif format.

Finally, feel free to provide a headshot and short bio (50-60 words) about yourself with an email address. Your headshot and bio will be placed at the end of your article so that members, readers, and unknown relatives can easily contact you.
