HOW TO USE THE NEHGS WEBSITE by LISA B. LEE

The nation's oldest and largest genealogical society, the New England Historic Genealogical Society (NEHGS) has over 20,000 members, and a research library in Boston, housing over 12 million records, many you won't find anywhere else. But you don't have to travel all the way to Massachusetts to access their records.

As an NEHGS member, you can access thousands of digital images, recorded seminars, articles on a wide range of topics, and their fabulous collection of research databases covering all of New England as well as Canada, and much of the British Isles.

Accessing their Web site has never been easier, with their recent redesign, but it can still be confusing, especially if you're new to NEHGS. Lisa will show you how and where to find what you need, so you'll end up using their site like a pro, whether you use a Mac or a PC.
