Although this genealogical resource has been around since 2008, not many researchers have made use of its unique resources until recently. USCIS has five types of files available: A-Files, Alien Registration Forms, C-Files, Registry Files, and Visa Files. Discover the unique information available. Though this is a fee-based resource, these are truly unique records with information and photos you may not be able to access elsewhere. Explore the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Genealogy Notebook! Find out the best way to utilize these resources.
