A U.S. county courthouse is one of the genealogist's first introductions to U.S. research and the "go to" repository for records that lead into an ancestor's daily life and helps establish the backbone of family history research. This presentation discusses strategies for success in finding original and replacement records lost due to fire, theft, flood, mold, rodents, tornado, hurricane, over-zealous "spring-cleaning clerks, and any other destruction in a county courthouse or other research repository. Learn strategies and techniques to further your research success.
