WW1 was a global conflict of unprecedented scale never before seen in Human History. In turn, American forces rapidly and necessarily grew from less than 200,000 soldiers and sailors to over 4.5 million at home and abroad, expanding to unprecedented size and organizational complexity. The military records attributed to the American Expeditionary Forces of WW1 mirror their evolution, composition, and new complexity. The collections are vast and widely disbursed at various federal and states repositories, and the great majority of records in paper form only, unindexed, thus requiring great patience, diligence, and determination by the researcher. David Goerss will explain the research landscape, as well as provide advice on utilizing a phased approach to your research to effectively locate and track your ancestor.
