MEXICO RESEARCH

George Fulton is a retired chemist and industrial hygienist. His interest in genealogy began when his father inherited the family papers of cousins Alice and Edna Rollins which included numerous family obituaries, photographs, notes on the family for several generations, and Alice's DAR application papers. Genealogical interests include New England, Austria and Germany, and Mexico. His interest in Mexican genealogy dates from his marriage to his wife Susan, who is of Mexican descent.

George's talk will be a survey of colonial and modern Mexican genealogical resources. Mexico has a post-conquest history of almost five hundred years, with remarkable documentation. Church records exist from the mid-1500s, and for some communities are remarkably complete from near the founding of those communities. Government archives in both Mexico and Spain add considerably, especially for the early colonial period.

George spoke at the first Nueva Galicia Genealogical Society Symposium, is a member of the on-line genealogical group Nuestros Ranchos, and only recently joined L-AGS. He has published an index of matrimonial investigations for the Asuncion de Maria parish in Aguascalientes, Mexico, for the period of the late 1600s to 1740s.
