An Introduction to the F.A.N. Principle, updated to include DNA Evidence. The F.A.N. Principle is an acronym coined by Elizabeth Shown Mills to describe a system of focusing genealogical research starting with the basics, (family, associates, and neighbors).

Susan Goss Johnston was a member of Yale University's first undergraduate class of women, graduating with a B.A. in physics. She is a 2011 ProGen alumna, has attended the National Institute on Federal Records), and completed the "Advanced Methodology and Evidence Analysis" course at the Institute of Genealogy and Historical Research. She is a co-editor of Source Templates for The Master Genealogist, a guide to creating computer source citation templates. Her personal research focuses on families in New England and the Mid-Atlantic region. Susan specializes in military records and has recently published two articles in the NGS Magazine, one on bounty land applications and another on World War I statement of service cards.
