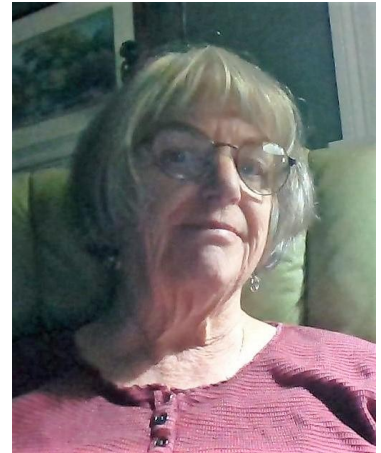

Exploring Irish Townlands

Historically life in rural Ireland centered around the townland. Investigating the lay of the land, either with a visit or by using map sites helps build an understanding of our ancestors lives. Culling the available records for a townland can add generations to our Irish families. Come explore some tried and true and some new Irish resources, both online and off.

Cath Madden Trindle - What began as a passion for discovering family led to a Certificate in British Isles Research from BYU and an Advanced Certificate in Genealogical Librarianship from NIGS (Toronto). Cath was board certified from 2002-2012. Specializing in Irish research, storytelling, records of the Great Depression and California, she has spoken on a variety of topics at the national, state and local level. Over the years she served as treasurer for many societies including the Federation of Genealogical Societies, as projects chair for the former California State Genealogical Alliance and the San Mateo County Genealogical Society. She is a member of the Association of Professional Genealogists, the International Irish Genealogical Society and Irish Genealogical Society (Ireland), and a life member of NGS, SMC GS, CGS.
