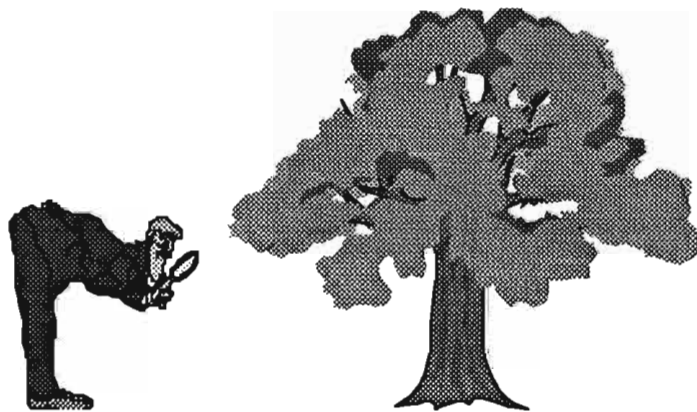

GENEALOGICAL SEMINAR SLATED

Featured will be Ron Bremer of Salt Lake City, a nationally known genealogy teacher and lecturer.

The seminar will consist of classes, demonstrations and a hands-on computer workshop, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Hillcrest LDS Church, 1501 Hillcrest Avenue, Livermore.

Cost is \$5 per family. Snacks and juices will be supplied free, but participants will be responsible for their own lunches.

Advance registration is recommended, as attendance will be limited to 250 persons and a full house is anticipated.

province in North America.

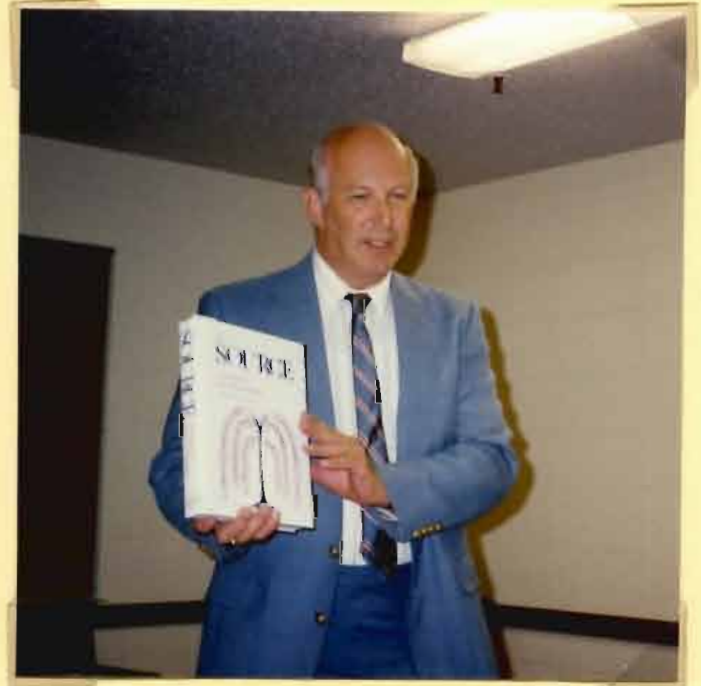

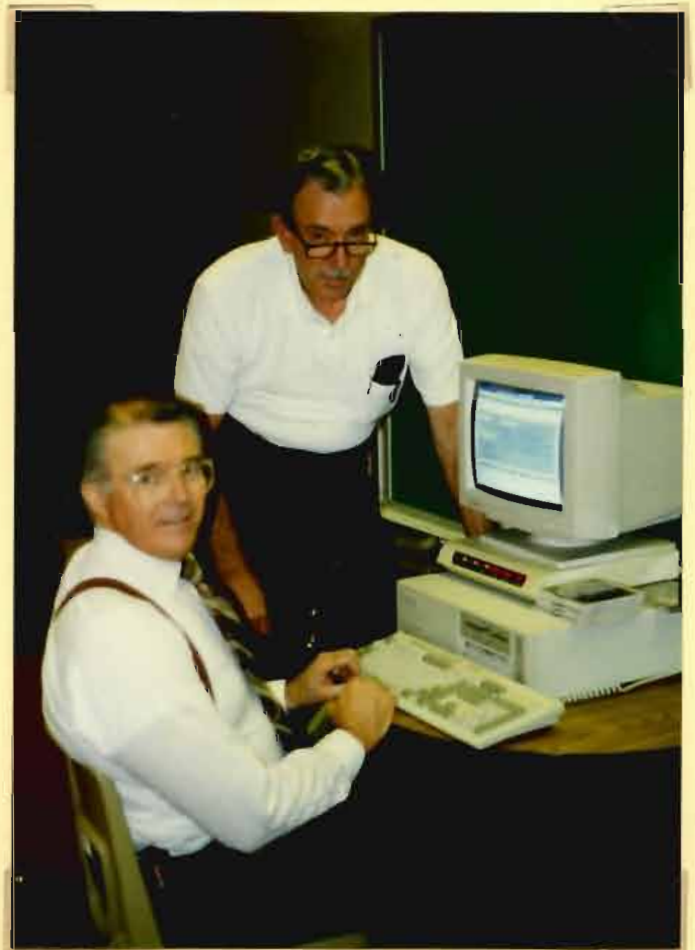

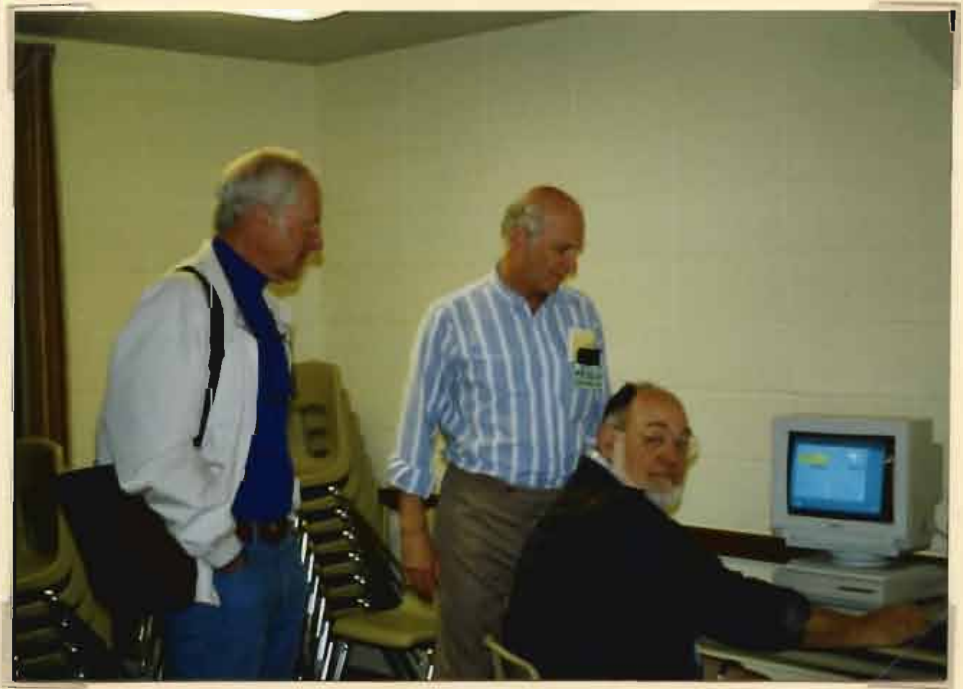
