The discriminatory legislation that created lengthy interrogations of Chinese and some other immigrants has a silver lining for genealogists. Thousands of files are in the collections of the National Archives. Come learn about some of the records that are available, what the Angel Island Immigration Station Foundation has been doing to learn about and share the stories of these immigrants, and take a look at some of presenter Grant Din's own research on his family.

Mr. Din is director of special projects at the Angel Island Immigration Station Foundation. He has been an avid family history researcher for over thirty years. He (along with Kay Speaks) was one of the organizers of the Chinese American Family History Conference in Oakland last year. He is a graduate of Yale and Claremont Graduate University. He has worked with nonprofit organization boards and served on their boards for over twenty-five years.

Do you have a GEDCOM file? Do you want to present your genealogy work on a web site but don't know HTML? Whether you are an experienced computer user with HTML, PHP or MySQL experience or a historian, TNG will work for you. Four years ago L-AGS member, Kristina Ahuja, discovered this web software and has been using it ever since. There are 8 templates you can use, or you can create your own web site design. If you can upload a GEDCOM, you can have a great website to present your genealogy. TNG can also be used as a stand-alone genealogy software program.

There are many ways to customize your website. L-AGS and SRVGS member, Bill George, has started a TNG Special Interest Group. Members meet monthly, share ideas and solve TNG problems. Bill and Kristina will be our guest speakers, presenting TNG (The Next Generation of Genealogy Software) at the September L-AGS Study Group Meeting.

#### SUMMARY OF L-AGS BOARD MEETING August 23, 2011

This summary was prepared by Patricia Northam, our recording secretary:

L-AGS now has 222 members. Twelve members are new since January.

L-AGS assets are now at \$10,911.09.

Patrick Lofft reported that we will need 112 volunteers to help with the Heritage Happening in October. Each time slot needs 2 greeters, 2 guides, and 4 computer helpers. Maps will be posted so visitors can note ancestral roots.

In September the recommended change to the Bylaws, Article VI, Section C, will be voted upon. We hope to have a quorum for this vote of the membership.

Teresa Fraser shared the four choices of logos from which Twitter wishes us to select. Our Twitter logo will have the word "Twitter" with a bird.

The new book, "Pleasanton Presbyterian Church: Early Birth, Marriage, and Death Records of the Church," is now available online and on the Lulu website.

George Anderson will order copies for L-AGS to donate to the local libraries and heritage groups.
