April Board Meeting held on April 24, 2012

L-AGS now has 173 memberships and 213 members.

Begin now with a small article. A few paragraphs are a beginning. Your initial success will be your springboard for braver future articles. Tell all of us the tale of your favorite research discovery. Which of your findings filled you with awe, surprise and pride?

Our Roots Tracer offers all members the opportunity to preserve their family chronicles in print and on the Internet. Some generations don't care, but other generations will. We want to make sure that, when someone is interested, even 100 years from now, the basic information will be there for them in the Library of Congress as well as on the World Wide Web. We can honor the struggles that our ancestors went through...they shouldn't be forgotten, especially the women, who are less frequently found in public documents.

They are available to assist you in your genealogy research. The FHC has several subscription research sites not readily available elsewhere. 



Local genealogist works with others to care for their family trees

A genealogist is part detective, part secretary and part family historian. And, with the advent of many computer-based resources, today's genealogists are also likely to be electronically connected to their counterparts and to hundreds of data banks around the world.

Dick Finn, a Livermore resident since 1959, and current president of the Livermore-Amador Genealogical Society, has spent the last 10 years immersing himself in family history. He became a member seven years ago after a relative introduced him to the joys of genealogy. union "My aunt, now 99, decided that I was the 2003.

Finn has worked on family history for both sides of his family and he and his wife Wanda, also a L-AGS member, are also tracing her family roots.

Last year they took an Elderhostel class in Denmark, and while traveling the country were able to gather information on both of their famili
