Hopefully you are putting the finishing touches on your first article for The Roots Tracer. If you need assistance composing your story, the Roots Tracer staff mailto:tracer@LAGS.org and/or mailto:managing.editor@L-AGS.org is willing and able to help you. Written articles should be approximately 300 to 1,000 words. Photos and lineage charts always increase the reader's interest in your revelations.

Begin now with a small article. A few paragraphs are a beginning. Your initial success will be your springboard for braver future articles. Tell all of us the tale of your favorite research discovery. Which of your findings filled you with awe, surprise and pride?

Our Roots Tracer offers all members the opportunity to preserve their family chronicles in print and on the Internet. Some generations don't care, but other generations will. We want to make sure that, when someone is interested, even 100 years from now, the basic information will be there for them in the Library of Congress as well as on the World Wide Web. Our memories are a library of information that could be irretrievably lost. We can honor the struggles that our ancestors went through...they shouldn't be forgotten, especially the women, who are less frequently found in public documents.

Member-to-Member Book Loan Program

In the Summer 1988 issue of the LAGS quarterly, The Roots Tracer, the following notice appeared.

Member-to-Member Loans

The Livermore-Amador Genealogical Society is putting together a list of privately-owned books, periodicals and other materials that members are willing to loan to each other. Members are asked to make arrangements between themselves as to the length of time in borrower's possession, and when and how the material is to be returned. The library committee suggests that the loans be for no more than one month. We also recommend that the borrower sign some sort of note with the name of the items borrowed, the due date, and the borrower's name and phone number. This is the same as our library procedure. The library committee will not be responsible for the books, or keeping track of them. We assume that our members will honor the agreement and will be sure to return all books on time and in good condition. Anyone who has items to loan and hasn't received a form at a meeting, please send a list of your materials to the LAGS Library Committee, P.O. Box 901, Livermore, CA 94550. Database for the Pleasanton Genealogy Library

This book is a supplement to

Catalog of the Pleasanton Genealogy Library, comprising holdings of the Gayle Pipes Memorial Library of the Livermore-Amador Genealogical Society, and genealogical holdings of the Pleasanton Branch Library of Alameda County.

The Catalog is a simple Call Number-Title-Author listing, in call number order, of the 605 sets of books in the Pleasanton Genealogy Library. The listing is followed by a subject index to the books. This Database printout lists the same 605 sets of books in the same order, but it gives complete bibliographic information for the books. Whereas the Catalog with its index is intended as a finding aid, the Database is a intended as a source of fuller information about a book, once it is found.

All information in both books is taken verbatim from the Alameda County Online Public Access Catalog.
