How to Create a Research Notes Summary Report: After you have taken your research trip (physical or internet), you need to document your process and research results. It's not enough to simply enter dates, places, events, and document images in your genealogy software. You need a report that provides detailed research notes, document by document, followed by analysis and conclusions, as well as document images, transcriptions, tables and charts. Imagine a report that can be created by TMG from data you have previously entered into your database! See an example of such a report on Sue's website:

Optimistically, you began the New Year with a draft of your first article for the Roots Tracer. If you seek assistance composing your story, the Roots Tracer staff is prepared and eager to help you. Send an email to: mailto:rootstracer.chair@L-AGS.org.

Written articles should be approximately 300 to 1,000 words. Photos and lineage charts always increase the reader's interest in your revelations. Begin now with a small article. A few paragraphs are a beginning. Your initial success will be your springboard for braver future articles. Tell all of us the tale of your favorite research discovery. Which of your findings filled you with awe, surprise and pride?

Our Roots Tracer offers all members the opportunity to preserve their family chronicles in print and on the Internet. Some generations don't care, but unborn generations will. We want to make sure that, when a descendant or distant cousin is interested, even 100 years from now, the basic information will be there for them in the Library of Congress as well as on the World Wide Web. Our memories are a library of information that could be irretrievably lost. We can honor the struggles that our ancestors went through...they shouldn't be forgotten, especially the women, who are less frequently found in public documents.
