In Memory of Bob Ware

On July 21, 2013, long time L-AGS member Bob Ware passed away in Livermore. He is survived by his wife Norma Harris Ware and his two children and their families. He will be interred at the San Joaquin Valley National Cemetery with military honors.

NEW COLLECTION OF GENEALOGICAL INFORMATION JUST RELEASED

L-AGS has posted a new database on its Web site which will be of interest to people researching the history of the Tri-Valley area. This is the first of several books that L-AGS will be placing online and in print based on the research of the late Mildred "Millie" Freitas.

"Millie" Freitas, 1919-2012, was a well-known Tri-Valley genealogist who hired students to transcribe birth, marriage, death and other vital data from microfilm of early issues of the Livermore Herald. She compiled it all in a typewritten manuscript in 2000, and made it ready to publish, but never did so for some unknown reason.

Our database consists of searchable images of the typescript, plus a newly compiled index of 11,000+ entries. To view the data, go to http://www.L-AGS.org and click on "Searchable Local Records - Cemetery, Census, etc." Then scroll down to the category "Biographical and historical data" and click on "The Mildred E. Freitas Collection: Genealogical data extracted from the Livermore [California] Herald, 1899-1913." The print version of this book is now available from Lulu at http://www.l-ags.org/pubs.html. Editors of the Web and print editions are George Anderson, Patrick Lofft and Terry Berry. We thank Doug Mumma for many contributions.

In addition, the Livermore High School book has been revised to include over 48% more names than the first edition. It includes rosters of graduating seniors from the Livermore school, the first Union High School to be approved by state authorities in California, as well as an unbroken run of rosters from 1893-1969. Some of the annual rosters were compiled by the school many years after the graduation and include short retrospective biographies of the student. A few paragraphs are a beginning. Your initial success will be your springboard for braver future articles. Tell all of us the tale of your favorite research discovery. Which of your findings filled you with awe, surprise and pride? The deadline for the November 2013 issue is October 1.

Our Roots Tracer offers all members the opportunity to preserve their family chronicles in print and on the Internet. Some generations don't care, but unborn generations will. We want to make sure that, when a descendant or distant cousin is interested, even 100 years from now, the basic information will be there for them in the Library of Congress as well as on the World Wide Web. Our memories are a library of information that could be irretrievably lost. We can honor the struggles that our ancestors went through...they shouldn't be forgotten, especially the women, who are less frequently found in public documents.
