Newspapers are valuable in genealogical research because you can find information about births, deaths, marriages, moves, business, naturalizations, court cases, and more. Millions of pages of the world's newspapers are now accessible online, but there is no one place to find them all. This class gives an overview of what is available online and techniques to help improve your chances of finding information about your relatives.

Janice M. Sellers is a professional genealogist who specializes in Jewish and newspaper research. She is the publicity director for the San Francisco Bay Area Jewish Genealogical Society and the editor of three genealogy journals. She is also a member of the Association of Professional Genealogists, the Genealogical Speakers Guild, the California Genealogical Society, and the African-American Genealogical Society of Northern California, among others. "Publish or Regret." Will your descendants regret your failure to publish? Share with all of us the tale of your favorite research discovery. What ancestral anecdote will you share during holiday gatherings? Write up the Family History anecdote that will captivate the attention of your holiday table. Optimistically, you are drafting your first article for the Roots Tracer.

Written articles should be approximately 300 to 1,000 words. Photos and lineage charts always increase the reader's interest in your revelations. Begin now with a small article. A few paragraphs are a beginning. Your initial success will be your springboard for braver future articles. Tell all of us the tale of your favorite research discovery. Which of your findings filled you with awe, surprise and pride?

Our Roots Tracer offers all members the opportunity to preserve their family chronicles in print and on the Internet. Some generations don't care, but unborn generations will. We want to make sure that, when a descendant or distant cousin is interested, even 100 years from now, the basic information will be there for them in the Library of Congress as well as on the World Wide Web. Our memories are a library of information that could be irretrievably lost. We can honor the struggles that our ancestors went through...they shouldn't be forgotten, especially the women, who are less frequently found in public documents.
