Writing a family narrative is a great way to highlight conflicts and holes in your research; and a fascinating narrative will bring your family to life. If writing your family's story seems a daunting task, all you need to do is write it one byte at a time.

Susan Goss Johnston is a 2011 ProGen alumna, a graduate of the Advanced Methodology and Evidence Analysis course at the Institute of Genealogy and Historical Research, the National Institute on Genealogical Research, and the National Archives' lecture and lab course, *Going to the Source*. She is a co-editor of the recently published Source Templates for The Master Genealogist. Her personal research focuses on families in New England and the Mid-Atlantic region, and she specializes in military records. A former Maryland resident, she now lives in California, and continues teaching intermediate and advanced genealogy courses. She is a frequent speaker at local meetings and conferences.

Your bio will be placed at the end of your article so that members, readers, and unknown relatives can easily contact you.

By submitting an article for publication in the Livermore Roots Tracer, you agree to grant the Livermore-Amador Genealogical Society one-time print publication rights, and the right to publish the article on its website in the Roots Tracer Archive. All other rights not expressly granted in this agreement are fully reserved by you.
