Although this genealogical resource has been around since 2008, not many researchers have made use of its unique resources until recently. USCIS has five types of files available: A-Files, Alien Registration Forms, C-Files, Registry Files, and Visa Files. Discover the unique information available. Though this is a fee-based resource, these are truly unique records with information and photos you may not be able to access elsewhere. Explore the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Genealogy Notebook! Find out the best way to utilize these resources.

Kay joined L-AGS in 1999. Since then she has been involved in L-AGS special interest groups and county fair project, as participant, leader, or coordinator. She has organized meetings, workshops and seminars for L-AGS, CGS, Chinese American Family History Group, and the Tri-Valley TMG Users Group. Kay has presented a variety of family history topics in Alameda, Contra Costa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara and Tulare Counties to historical, genealogical, retirement groups, libraries, museums, special interest groups, including Family History Day 2013 on Angel Island at the Immigration Station where her Chinese family was detainees during the Chinese Exclusion Era. Articles should be saved in either Microsoft Word (.doc or .docx) or Rich Text format. Use footnotes to cite sources for facts that are not general knowledge. No need to worry about knowing how to cite history sources, our editors can assist you with this task. Photographs should also be emailed as separate files and labeled. Please include possible captions for each item. Photographs, when scanned, should be in either .jpg or .tif format. Finally, provide a short bio (50-60 words) with an email address. Your bio will be placed at the end of your article so that members, readers, and unknown relatives can easily contact you.

By submitting an article for publication in the Livermore Roots Tracer, you agree to grant the Livermore-Amador Genealogical Society one-time print publication rights, and the right to publish the article on its website in the Roots Tracer Archive. 
