Minniear recently co-wrote Dublin and the Tri-Valley: The World War II Years, a pictorial history of Camp Parks, Camp Shoemaker, Shoemaker Naval Hospital and Livermore Naval Air Station. He holds a number of positions related to Dublin's history and heritage. He sits on the Dublin City Heritage and Cultural Arts Commission and is president of the Dublin Historical Preservation Association. Steve is the volunteer archivist for Dublin's Heritage Park and Museums and the volunteer curator for Dublin's latest acquisition of historical material, the Camp Parks collection. In March 2014, he spoke on the area's World War II history at the Firehouse Theater as part of the Pleasanton Museum on Main's An Evening With ... series.

Mr. Minniear retired after 32 years of service with the Federal government in the national security field, including 22 years with the Department of Energy. He has a master's degree in Government from Georgetown University and received his undergraduate degree in Political Science from the University of California, Berkeley. He is a member of the Society for Military History and has written over 15 book reviews for the Journal of Military History. Steve is a long time Dublin resident.

Photographs should also be emailed as separate files and labeled. Please include possible captions for each item. Photographs, when scanned, should be in either .jpg or .tif format. Finally, feel free to provide a headshot and short bio (50-60 words) about yourself with an email address. Your headshot and bio will be placed at the end of your article so that members, readers, and unknown relatives can easily contact you.
