# **National Family History Month**

In celebration of "National Family History Month", the L-AGS Genealogical Society is again holding outreach events during the month of October at local libraries to promote public interest in family heritage by helping visitors look for their ancestors in census and other records. We call these events "Tri-Valley Heritage Happenings". L-AGS needs volunteers to participate and assist in these events. The positions and functions needed are listed below:

L-AGS seeks **"greeters"** to meet the public at the library doors and direct them to the proper location in the library. No knowledge or use of computers is required.

L-AGS seeks genealogy "**guides**" who can use the library supplied computers to assist the public to locate the census records of their family using the available software on the Library computers. If the "**guide**" desires, they may bring their own computer.

L-AGS seeks **"facilitators"** who will volunteer to bring and use their own Wi-Fi enabled laptop computers at the libraries to assist the public.

L-AGS is not affiliated with the Mormon (LDS) Church. L-AGS does however partner with the Livermore LDS Family History Center (FHC) for various non-denominational genealogical events such as educational seminars, guest speakers, indexing projects and special interest groups. LDS facilities at their 950 Mocho Street, Livermore complex are often used for these. Note: The entrance is in the front of the building on the right—there is a sign on the door. If the parking in front of the building is full, there is a large parking lot in the rear of the building.

Finally, feel free to provide a headshot and short bio (50-60 words) about yourself with an email address. Your headshot and bio will be placed at the end of your article so that members, readers, and unknown relatives can easily contact you.
