The Records Behind the WWI Draft Registrations

DATE: Monday, March 9, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. **Location:** Remote Zoom **Speaker:** Susan Goss Johnston

The 1973 fire in the National Personnel Records Center destroyed about 80 percent of World War I Army personnel Records. Fill the gaps in your WWI soldier's military life with the records behind the World War I draft registration cards. Susan Goss Johnston was a member of Yale University's first undergraduate class of women, graduating with a B.A. in physics. She is a 2011 ProGen alumna, has attended the National Institute on Federal Records), and completed the "Advanced Methodology and Evidence Analysis" course at the Institute of Genealogy and Historical Research. She is a co-editor of Source Templates for The Master Genealogist, a guide to creating computer source citation templates. Her personal research focuses on families in New England and the Mid-Atlantic region. Susan specializes in military records and has recently published two articles in the NGS Magazine, one on bounty land applications and another on World War I statement of service cards.

Use footnotes to cite sources for facts that are not general knowledge. No need to worry about knowing how to cite history sources, our editors can assist you with this task. Photographs should also be emailed as separate files and labeled. Please include possible captions for each item. Photographs, when scanned, should be in either .jpg or .tif format.

Finally, feel free to provide a headshot and short bio (50-60 words) about yourself with an email address. Your headshot and bio will be placed at the end of your article so that members, readers, and unknown relatives can easily contact you.
