Cowboys and Ranchers in the Livermore Area DATE: Monday, September 12, 2022 at 7:00 p.m Location: Zoom Speaker: Dick Finn

Livermore City Historian Richard Finn will tell tales from the bygone era of cowboys and ranchers in old Livermore during a virtual presentation.

"What we do is we talk about the ranchers and farmers that were first here in the valley," Finn said. "That's Amador over in the Dublin area, and of course, Robert Livermore here in the Livermore area. Then we talk about those that came later — Mendenhall and them. And then we end up talking about the farmers and ranchers that are now active in the valley, and some of the problems they have with their land and the drought and people trespassing."

Richard has lived in the Livermore Valley since 1959 when he started work at Sandia National Laboratories/California from where he retired in 1996 as manager of Integrated Design Services and Engineering Information Management. In retirement he has spent a great deal of time studying his family history including publishing family histories. For some time, Richard has been researching Tri-Valley pioneer families with the help of his cousin Peter. They have developed a database of over 40,000 names of pioneers and their descendants. Richard has been president of both L-AGS and the San Ramon Genealogical Society and the last several years has served as the Livermore City Historian.

Use footnotes to cite sources for facts that are not general knowledge. No need to worry about knowing how to cite history sources, our editors can assist you with this task. Photographs should also be emailed as separate files and labeled. Please include possible captions for each item. Photographs, when scanned, should be in either .jpg or .tif format.

Finally, feel free to provide a headshot and short bio (50-60 words) about yourself with an email address. Your headshot and bio will be placed at the end of your article so that members, readers, and unknown relatives can easily contact you.
