#### EDITORIAL

Your Editor wishes to express his deep personal appreciation to Ed Pyle and Bishop Probst for making the cultural hall of the LDS church available for our meetings. This generous action will release funds we have been paying the library for a meeting room. These funds should be spent wisely in helping us trace our family histories, and aid the cause of genealogy.

A good way to get to the church is to go down First Street to Holmes Street, turn left on Holmes. Just after you have crossed the Arroyo Mocho bridge, turn right on Mocho St. You cannot miss the church, which is on your right at 950 Mocho St. (It is the second church on the right.) Ed Pyle will have the lights on for us.

Since the Hayward area Genealogical Association and the Contra Costa Association have offered to trade surname lists with us, it is important that those of us who have not turned in our surname and locality cards do so as soon as possible. It is important that we have localities and time periods being researched on each surname card, as well as a separate set of locality cards.

Most libraries are arranged by locality and time, so those of us who have submitted surname cards not showing localities and time periode being researched should contact Pat Saltgaver. She can then make up a computer listing for each member. As you discover new surnames, send a new card for each to Pat. Let's multiply our efforts through cooperative research; that's what genealogical associations are all about.

We have received official permission to work on the historical papers now at Livermore City Hall.
