- YOU MAY LIST AS MANY DIFFERENT LOCALITIES AS NECESSARY ON ONE SURNAME CARD.
- YOU DO NOT NEED TO MAKE SEPARATE LOCALITY CARDS. I CAN CREATE A LOCALITY LIST FROM THE SURNAME CARDS. IF YOU ARE MISSING SOME OF THE INFORMATION REQUESTED JUST LEAVE THAT AREA BLANK. IF ALL GOES WELL I HOPE TO COMPLETE OUR LIST BY CHRISTMAS.
